

NATIVE AMERICANS

We're All God's Children has been honored to serve alongside the Lakota Sioux of South Dakota since 2008. Our work began on the Pine Ridge Reservation, where we offered free vision screenings and eyeglasses, along with medical supplies, books, and warm hats for children. These early efforts laid the foundation for long-term relationships rooted in trust, respect, and Christ-centered service.



In 2015, we expanded our mission through a partnership with the Cheyenne River Youth Project on the Cheyenne River Reservation. Our focus is to support and strengthen the work already being done within the community—especially efforts that inspire hope, pride, and a renewed appreciation for Lakota language and culture among today's youth.

We are also privileged to provide ongoing support to the Medicine Wheel Retirement Community, the Old Agency Homeless Shelter, and the Veterans Food Bank, helping meet practical needs while honoring the dignity and resilience of every individual we serve.

Through partnership, humility, and faith, we seek to reflect God's love by walking alongside those who are already making a lasting difference. Every effort is culturally respectful and community-driven.

ZAMBIA

We're All God's Children began our work in Zambia in 2008, walking alongside rural villages where resources are scarce but hope is strong. Our heart is to serve in partnership with local leaders—meeting practical needs while sharing the love of Christ.

We bring short-term mission teams to serve in small, rural villages where help is most needed—building relationships, encouraging communities, and working hand-in-hand with local leaders.

Our work includes:

- Supporting schools and education to equip children for a brighter future
- Providing clean water wells that dramatically improve health and daily life
- Offering free vision clinics with eyeglasses and visual aids that restore sight and dignity
- Hosting educational workshops and life-skills training such as carpentry and tailoring, equipping men and women with skills to care for their families.



Above all, we seek to share the Good News of Jesus Christ—bringing Bibles, sharing God's Word, and serving as the hands and feet of Christ, grounded in love, respect, and long-term partnership.

KENYA

We're All God's Children began our work in Kenya in 2022, partnering with trusted local ministries to equip underserved individuals with practical, life-changing skills.

Heart of Worship Tabernacle Church (Eldoret)

- In partnership with the church, we support tailoring classes for men and women in and around Eldoret. We provided seed funding for sewing machines, equipment, supplies, and fabrics, along with scholarships that enable students to gain marketable skills to support their families. We also continue to pray with the church as they move forward with plans to build their own church on recently purchased land.

Adia Training Center (Nairobi)

- At the Adia Training Center, teens and adults participate in a Fashion Design program that teaches apparel-making skills using industrial sewing machines. Our support has helped purchase machines, equipment, and supplies, empowering graduates to establish small fashion businesses.

Through partnership, training, and prayer, we seek to serve with love and purpose—building hope and opportunity in Christ's name.
